HOWEVER, the need to open entries to inspect items when spoilage appears may be necessary.</p> <p>2. All jars must be clear glass standard canning jars, either half pint or quart jars. Must be clean and rings and lids should be free of rust. NO OTHER JARS WILL BE ACCEPTED. All products must have been sealed by water bath or pressure canner. Paraffin is not accepted.</p>
